

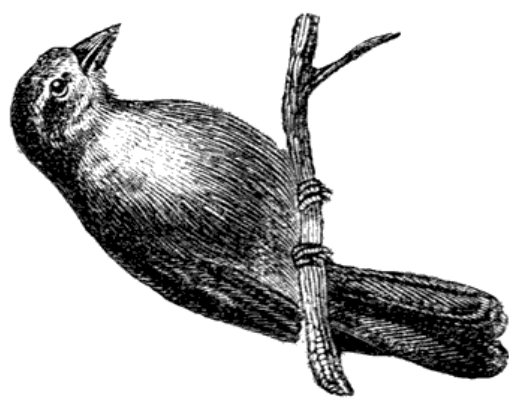

BIRDS OF THE RECLAIMED FLAMBEAU MINE

Built in partnership with the city of Ladysmith, the Reclaimed Flambeau Mine Nature Trails offer 4 miles of beautiful walking trails open from dawn to dusk. Trail maps may be found at the intersection of each trail.

Located on nearly 150 acres, the site offers trails through grasslands, woodlands and wetland areas.

The Reclaimed Flambeau Mine has been restored to prairie grasslands, wetlands and two types of young forest communities. Results of vegetative monitoring 2000 through 2005 show that the grassland, young forests, and wetlands are composed of diverse native plant species and already providing habitat for many species of birds. The bird species on the reclaimed site reflect the habitat conditions that have been created. Habitat around the site consists primarily of the Flambeau River and riparian corridor. Wetlands, continuous deciduous forests and fallow fields are also present in adjoining lands.
